1. RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*. RRS. Appendix E shall apply

1.2 The 'Rules for Championships Sailing, Windsurfing and Kiteboarding' will apply.

1.3 The equipment Rules of sailing, the heat management system and IRSA Addendum Q will apply

1.4 RRS(s) will be changed as follows: 35, A4, A5 see 15.1, 66, E 6.5 see 16.2 and 16.5, 62.2 see 16.6, 65.2 see 16.7, 62.2 see 16.8.

1.5 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence..

1.6 Every competitor who has his domicile in the Netherlands shall have the appropriate license.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board(s) located at the boathouse..

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 09:00 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 19:00 on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed at the racing area.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

6 COMPETITORS AS OBSERVERS

6.1 The race committee shall appoint observers. All competitors shall serve as observers as required by the race committee.

6.2 A competitor unable to serve as an observer for a heat shall obtain prior approval from the race committee. Approval shall normally only be granted if a competitor's boat requires immediate repairs or on medical or safety grounds. Alternatively, the competitor shall nominate a substitute observer, who shall also be a competitor. The competitor shall ensure that the substitute is present in the Control Area and that the race committee is notified of the substitute's name and sail number.

6.3 An observer appointed for a heat who is not present in the control area from the Warning Signal until released by the race committee, or who fails to act diligently as an observer, may be protested by the race committee under rule 60.2(a).

7 RACING AREAS

7.1 The racing area is near the boat house.

7.2 The control area which must be used by the competitors during racing will be shown on the notice board before the first race of the day. This also applies to judges and observers.

7.3 Competitors who are not racing are not allowed in the race area.

8 THE COURSES

8.1 The course, start and finish lines will be shown on the notice board as required by RRS E 3.3

8.2 The first mark will be announced one minute before the starting signal latest by showing a colour flag matching the colour of the first mark. The next mark on portside of the first mark will be the spreader mark.

9 MARKS

9.1 Marks of the course have different colours.

9.2 The starting and finishing marks will be yellow buoys

10 ABANDONING

In the event of a rowboat entering the racecourse during a heat, the race will be abandoned and re-sailed immediately.

11 THE START

11.1 Races will be started by using RRS 26 as amended by RRS E 3.4

11.2 The starting line will be between two yellow buoys

11.3 The Race Committee shall hail the heat and race number of the next heat. It is the competitor's responsibility to hear this call and for the boat to compete in her assigned heat. Failure to hear and comply with the Race Committee's hail shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.

11.4 Following a general recall the warning signal shall be made as soon as possible.

12 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will announce the next mark verbally.

13 THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between two yellow buoys

14 HEAT COMPOSITION

The heat composition shall be posted on the Heat Board near the control area.

15 TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

15.1 Boats failing to finish within 5 min. after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored DNS without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5

15.2 No boat shall start after the first boat in the heat has finished.

16 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

16.1 Protests and requests for redress need not be in writing. This changes RRS 61.2. The protest committee may take evidence in any way it considers appropriate and may communicate its decision orally.

16.2 Parties to a protest shall be informed orally by hailing that a protest hearing is opening. It is the responsibility of the parties to come to the hearing without delay accompanied by any witness. No other notice of the hearing shall be given. This changes RRS 63.2.

16.3 The IRSA SYRPH (System for Reducing Protest Hearings) shall be used, when applicable, before a formal protest hearing is opened.

16.4 Protest forms are available at the race office in the boathouse.

16.5 The protest time limit is 5 minutes after the last boat has finished in her heat or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. This changes RRS E 6.5

16.6 Notices of protests by the race committee or protest committee will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b) RRS after using SYRPH as required.

16.7 Notices will be posted no later than 10 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of a hearing in which they are *parties* or named as witnesses.

Hearings will be held in the protest room in the boathouse and begin ASAP.

16.8 A request for correction of an error in the published results has to be delivered within the protest time limit of the last scheduled day of racing or within 60 minutes after posting of the results, if this is later. When the request is not granted, the protest time limit is 5 minutes after the boat is informed that the request is not granted. This changes RRS 62.2.

16.9 Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in rule 70.5. The RNYU has granted permission in accordance with RRS 70.5(a) and the prescriptions of the RNYU to this rule

17 SCORING

17.1 Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

17.2 The heat management system (HMS2016) shall apply unless the number of participants is less than 17.

17.3 A boat finishing in a heat to which she has not been assigned shall be scored DNS for the heat to which she was assigned. She shall not sail in her assigned heat.

20 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by a race committee, equipment inspector or measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

28 PRIZES

The responsible person of the winning boat acquires the title "Dutch Champion", the Blue Pennant and medal of the RNWA.

Prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.

The best Dutch Sailor will be awarded the DIOMCA Wisseltrofee.

29 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4,.Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

30 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

31 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of Euro 1.500.000 per event or the equivalent.

32 ORGANISATION

The Primary Race officer is Stan Schouten.

The chairman of the protest committee is Geert Geelkerken.
